Housed in two long, Victorian coal drops (originally used to store fuel for the railways), this development now features over 50 shops, restaurants, and cultural spaces. The architecture alone is worth the visit – the undulating roof designed by Thomas Heatherwick creates a dramatic, airy arcade.

Inside, you will find a carefully chosen mix of fashion brands, homeware stores, and concept shops. Notable names include **Paul Smith** for tailored British fashion, **Aesop** for luxurious skincare, and **Wolf & Badger** showcasing independent designers. If you are looking for unique gifts, **Labour and Wait** offers timeless household goods, while **Toogood** presents sculptural furniture and clothing. The emphasis here is on quality and originality, making Coal Drops Yard a highlight among **shops in Kings Cross St Pancras**.

# St Pancras International Retail Arcade

Inside the main terminal of St Pancras International, a covered arcade offers a more compact but equally appealing shopping experience. Additionally, the station houses several **luxury shopping St Pancras** options, such as **Hackett** for classic menswear and **Thomas Pink** for premium shirts. The blend of high street and upscale

brands makes the arcade a pleasant place to browse even if your train is delayed.

# Kings Cross Station and the Underground

Don’t overlook the shopping opportunities inside Kings Cross station itself. While smaller in scale, the concourse contains a selection of useful stores for the traveller. **M&S Simply Food** is perfect for grabbing a meal deal or fresh produce, while **Boots** and **Superdrug** cover pharmacy and beauty needs. For a quick caffeine fix, there are numerous coffee chains including **Pret a Manger** and **Costa**. The station also has a **WHSmith** and a **Levi’s** outlet, meaning you can refresh your wardrobe while waiting for a connecting train.

If you step out of the station onto Euston Road, you will also find a branch of **Waitrose** – perfect for stocking up on groceries or a bottle of wine for the journey.

## INDEPENDENT AND BOUTIQUE SHOPPING

Beyond the main retail hubs, the streets surrounding Kings Cross are dotted with independent shops that reward exploration. Granary Square, just north of the station, is a lively public space flanked by restaurants and small boutiques. Here, you can find **Gay’s the Word**, a legendary independent bookshop specialising in LGBTQ+ literature – a true London institution. Nearby, **MagCulture** offers a curated selection of independent magazines, ideal for anyone who loves print media and design.

The area around King’s Boulevard and Pancras Road also features pop-up shops and artisan outlets, especially during weekends. If you are visiting on a Saturday, the **King’s Cross Farmers’ Market** (held on the green near the station) is a wonderful place to buy organic produce, artisan bread, and handmade crafts. This blend of permanent and temporary retail means the **shops in Kings Cross St Pancras** are always evolving, offering new discoveries with every visit.

## FOOD AND DRINK SHOPPING: A CULINARY JOURNEY

- **Kaffeine** – Though a coffee shop, they also retail their own beans and brewing equipment for those who want to recreate the experience at home.
- **Barrett’s Grocery** – A modern corner shop in the King’s Cross neighbourhood offering artisanal produce, deli items, and fine wines. It’s a great stop if you are staying locally.

Don’t miss the opportunity to visit the **Eat the Streets** food market located in the piazza outside the station on selected days – it’s not a shop per se, but you can purchase street food from around the world.

1. **Time your visit wisely** – Weekday mornings are quieter, especially at Coal Drops Yard. Late afternoons can get busy, particularly with commuters.
